Your Life Has Meaning (Part 1): Meaning in the Meaningless

1. Share at least one gospel truth and one challenge you got from the message.

2. Read Ecclesiastes chapters 1 & 2. How could someone in a position like Solomon's (possessing great wealth, power, fame, knowledge, personal encounters with God...) come to feel this way about life?
 - a. How have you or others you know come to similar conclusions?

3. Read 2 Corinthians 5:14-18. According to these verses, why did Jesus sacrifice his life for you?
 - a. What is the "worldly point of view" described in verse 16 and how does that compare with Ecclesiastes 1 & 2?

4. Think about the different aspects of your life (daily routine, work, relationships, etc.) How do they have meaning and purpose in light of Jesus' sacrifice for you?

5. CHALLENGE: This week, every time you go to class, study, or work, pray and dedicate your work to God and his glory; invite Jesus to be present with you and to work in you and through you.

1. Why was Esther an unlikely hero? Are you similar to Esther? How or how not?
2. God planted Esther to use her in a specific position for a very specific purpose. Where has God placed you? What purpose do you think God has for you?
