## Philemon (Part 2): From Slave to Sibling

1.	What were your main takeaways from the Sunday service and message?

- 2. Read Philemon 8-10, 13-14. Although Paul could have demanded that Philemon release Onesimus from slavery, why was it wise to appeal to him on the basis of love? How could you take a similar approach in your relationships?
- 3. Read Philemon 10-16. Make a list of all the terms Paul used to describe Onesimus. What was Paul trying to help Philemon understand about the person who had wronged him?
  - a. Think about a person who has wronged you. Write down their name and then use Paul's list and ask God to help you view them the way that God views them.
- 4. Read Philemon 17-21. How was Paul not just preaching the message of forgiveness through Jesus but also living it out? In what ways and situations can you personally grow in this area?



- 1. What was the last thing you owned that broke or stopped working? What did you do with it and why?
- 2. God's vision to Ezekiel gave the people of Israel and us hope. What does it mean to have hope? Is there a situation at school, home or with friends when you don't feel full of hope?
