Raise them Up

1. What were your main takeaways from the Sunday service and message?
2. Read Genesis 4:1-8. Sibling rivalries have occurred since the inception of sin. Sunday's message referenced the sibling rivalry of Rudi and Adi Dassler which infected their business dealings and eventually the whole town of Herzogenaurach, Germany. Sadly, Christians are not immune to hostility. How has the hostility you observe in the world affected you? How have you contributed to it?
3. Read Colossians 3:12-14. Bitterness and holding onto grudges can wreak havoc in every single relationship (at home, at work and at school). Thankfully the peace that comes from Jesus saving work on the cross can enable us to live in peace with one another. How does the forgiveness you receive from God play an important role in restoring your relationships?
4. Read Deuteronomy 6:4-9. According to these verses, the family unit was designed to be the primary incubator of faith. What can you do to help your immediate family be better at this? If you live alone, how can you support others in their role and what kind of support do you need?
5. Christian churches and schools can provide valuable assistance to families in telling the next generation the praiseworthy deeds of the LORD. At times parents have abdicated their calling of leading their families and handed it over to those institutions to do it for them. In what ways is Faith Church partnering with families and in what areas can we do better?
