

Faith Group Questions

Jesus is... (Part 3): Willing

1. What comforted you from the message and what challenged you?

2. Read Mark 1:40. What does the leper teach you about how to approach Jesus in prayer?
 - a. How is asking about Jesus' willingness different than asking about his ability?

3. Read Mark 1:41-42. What is revealed about Jesus in the way he responds to the leper? (To better understand the seriousness of being identified as a leper look up Leviticus 13 & 14, Numbers 12 and 2 Chronicles 26.)

4. How is leprosy a fitting and powerful picture of sin and the consequences of sin?
 - a. How was Jesus touching the leper a fitting and powerful picture of His atoning work on the cross?

5. Read Mark 1:43-45. The leper's response underlines a basic lesson of discipleship: the Lord's work should be done only in the Lord's way, according to the Lord's word. When have you been guilty of this kind of rogue discipleship? How can you apply this 'basic lesson of discipleship' to your own life right now?

Keep the conversation with your kids going using these questions based on the Faith Kids' lesson.

1. What are some things that might have caused you to feel lost or confused?
2. How do you think Jesus can give light to someone when he/she feels lost or confused inside?
3. Learning from Jesus helps His light grow in you. What are some ways you can learn from Jesus?
4. Jesus called himself the "Light of the World". What does that mean?
5. How will you reflect his light this week?
