Family Tree Part 1: Liar, Liar

1. Write down and share some of your biggest takeaways from Sunday's message.

2. What were some things that may have surprised you about Abraham's upbringing or his life choices?
 - a. How does his journey highlight God's undeserved love?

3. Abraham, though a great man of faith, also had his moments when he lapsed in his faith, and he tried to take situations into his own hands because of fear or uncertainty and those choices affected him as well as his wife Sarah. In what ways can you relate to Abraham's relying on himself instead of God or how can you relate to Sarah and her suffering on account of someone else's poor decisions?
 - a. How have you seen God redeem those negative situations and use them for your good and the good of others?

4. Abraham grew up in a home full of idolatry. He had major insecurity problems which negatively affected his relationship with his wife. He was far from perfect and yet God chose to use his family line to bring Jesus our Savior into the world! **Read Genesis 15:4-6.** What made Abraham and what makes you part of God's family tree?

Keep the conversation with your kids going using these questions based on the Faith Kids' lesson.

(These questions are based on Jeremiah 23:5-6)

1. Share about a promise you made to someone that you kept. Have you ever made a promise to someone that you weren't able to keep?
2. What's it like for you when someone doesn't keep his or her promise to you?
3. God waited 500 years to fulfill the promise he shared through Jeremiah. What do you think the people were thinking during those 500 years before Jesus was born? Why does God sometimes make us wait?
4. What difference does it make to you to know that God has always kept every promise he's made?
5. What are you waiting for? Pray to the Promise Keeper for patience and a stronger faith as you wait for Him to fulfill His promises, as He ALWAYS does.
