



Fire from Heaven Part 3: The LORD, He Is God

1. Read 1 Kings 18. How did Elijah's challenge to the prophets of Baal reveal the emptiness and futility of their idols? How can we apply this lesson to our own lives and the idols we struggle with?
2. In 1 Kings 18:21, Elijah asked the people, "How long will you waver between two opinions?" How does this question apply to us today when it comes to idolatry? What are some practical steps we can take to remain faithful in our worship to the LORD and avoid the lure of "false gods"?
3. We learned in this week's message that both Elijah and Jesus were fighting against the cultural norms that contaminated both the spiritual and secular lives of the people. What can we learn from their examples on how to lovingly and yet firmly deal with ideologies that are contrary to Scripture?
