



## *Fire from Heaven Part 7: The LORD of Integrity*

1. Read 2 Kings 5:15-16. Elisha refused Naaman's gifts, citing his service and commitment to the LORD. How does this story challenge you to maintain your values and principles even when tempted by personal gain?
  
2. Read 2 Kings 5:19-27. Gehazi's decision to pursue personal gain by deceiving Naaman contrasts with Elisha's integrity. What does Gehazi's behavior teach you about the potential dangers of compromising your values for personal benefit?
  
3. Read the following verses and discuss how to find contentment in the LORD:

Philippians 4:11-13

1 Timothy 6:6-8

Hebrew 13:5

Psalm 23



Ephesians 1:4, "For God chose us in Christ before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight."

1. What does this passage mean to you?
2. What do you think makes someone feel left out or unappreciated?
3. If a friend felt left out, how would you help him/her?
4. Jesus could have chosen anyone to be his disciple. Why did he choose a sinner like Matthew?
5. What do you think Jesus would say if you asked Him this question: "Jesus, what do You say about me?" Find a verse from the Bible that proves that.
6. Faith Challenge: Each morning this week, begin the day by saying aloud what Jesus thinks about you.
