- 2. Read Daniel 19:1-3. How can you apply Daniel's approach to Bible study, prayer, and repentance in your personal life?
- 3. God promised that after 70 years of captivity he would restore Jerusalem to the Israelites. This promise prompted Daniel to pray and repent. In Matthew 24:14 Jesus promised, "This gospel of the kingdom will be preached in the whole world as a testimony to all nations, and then the end will come." What does Jesus' promise prompt you to do?
- 4. Read Daniel 19:4-15. Notice that throughout this section Daniel constantly used the pronouns, "we, our and us." Discuss the significance of that and how can this be applied in your life of prayer and confession?
 - a. In those same verses Daniel prayed with a deep understanding of God's character. Reread those verses and make a list of God's characteristics. How can these help shape the way you pray to Him?
