1. Evaluate this statement: "It's wrong for Christians to have doubts about God and question his promises."

2. Read Matthew 11:2-3. Why might it be surprising that John would ask Jesus this question?
 - a. What did John wisely do to confront his doubts and what can you learn from his approach?

3. Read Matthew 11:4-6. According to Jesus' response, why could John and why can you be confident that Jesus is your Messiah, the Chosen One?

4. Jesus addressed John's doubts by pointing him back to what God reveals in his word. What are specific doubts or questions you've had about God, faith, or spiritual matters? Discuss these with your group and take time to address them with God's word.

5. Read Matthew 11:7-15. Though John had his doubts, how did Jesus speak about him to the crowd? Discuss how Jesus views you in the midst of your doubts.
