

## Philippians Part 3: "Called to Suffer"

1.	Read Philippians 1:27. Before we can conduct our lives in a manner worthy of the gospel,
	we must know what the gospel is. Explain the gospel as if you were trying to help a little
	child understand it and what are some key Bible passages you would use?

- a. Discuss what it looks like to conduct your lives in a manner worthy of the gospel, standing firm in the one Spirit, and striving together as one for the faith of the gospel.
- 2. Read Philippians 1:28. Paul says not to be frightened by those who oppose the gospel. What at times frightens or intimidates you from wanting to stand up for Jesus and why?
  - a. Discuss how you can help each other overcome your fears.
- 3. Read Philippians 1:29-30. Come up with as many examples of people from the Old and New Testaments who suffered because of their faith in God.
  - a. What is oddly comforting about knowing that you have not only been called to believe in Jesus as your Savior but also to suffer for him?

- 5. What would happen if your whole family prayed for the Holy Spirit's power? What might happen if you prayed daily for Holy Spirit power for your church?
