



Galatians Part 3: "Children of God"

1. Read Galatians 3:1-5. In these verses, Paul challenges the Galatians concerning their understanding of faith and observing the law. How does Paul's argument challenge the way you might rely on your own efforts rather than on faith in Christ?
2. Read Galatians 3:6-9. According to these verses, how does a Gentile become a "child of Abraham"?
3. Read Galatians 3:26-27. Paul emphasizes that through faith in Christ, believers are "all children of God." How does this spiritual adoption impact your relationship with God and with others?
4. Read Galatians 3:28. This verse speaks about the unity found in Christ, breaking down barriers of ethnicity, social status, and gender. How can you be more intentional about living out this unity, especially in a diverse and divided world?
5. Considering verses 28-29, how should our understanding of being "heirs according to the promise" influence the way we view our inheritance in Christ and our responsibility to others within the family of faith?



*Titus 3:4-5, "But when the **kindness** and love of God our Savior appeared, he saved us."*

*Romans 12:18, "As far as it depends on you, **live at peace** with everyone."*

1. When you feel annoyed, what helps calm you down?

2. What did Saul do that upset David? How did David respond?

3. What have you done to upset God?

4. How does God show you kindness instead of giving you what you deserve?

5. Think of a situation or someone (don't say the person's name aloud) that annoys you. What is one thing you can do to show kindness instead of getting annoyed?
